#### What is a Doctoral School?


Structure organizing PhD training Ruled by a law (25th May 2016, modified August 2022), labelled after national evaluation (HCERES).

- Selection, ministry fellowship attribution
- Control of the quality of supervision
- Respect of the thesis' chart
- Organization of scientific and intellectual exchanges
- Organization of Training courses
- Support for professional insertion and follow-up of PhDs
- Training to scientific integrity

#### Get a strong background in research

#### - Scientific autonomy

Ability to analyze a scientific question
Ability to set up experimental strategies
Ability to produce results
Ability to critically analyze and interpret data, publish

#### - Scientific skills

English writing and reading
Bibliographic synthesis, review and reports writing
Oral presentation (meetings, defence)

#### - Valorization

Scientific publications
After-PhD insertion project





### Stakes of the PhD

#### Achieve a professional project

- Team work in a research lab
  - Team integration
  - Project appropriation
  - Production of high quality results
- Define one's training plan
  - Meetings (national, international)
  - "Journées de l'ED" (organization, participation)
  - Training courses proposed by the ED, EUR & the UCA

=> should appear in your 'doctoral convention' (Portefolio)





## **Stakes of the PhD:**

- Get a strong background in research
- Achieve a professional project
- => start your own career





# **Rights:**

- Quality of mentoring and supervision
- Application of the Thesis chart (read CARREFULLY)
- Financial support throughout the thesis
- <u>Mediation</u> concerning any integration, supervision, progress issue: **Please, do not hesitate to ask the ED**!
  - ED PhD representative Students
  - ED executive team, Council members
  - CSI (new version)
  - Mid-term auditions (cancelled in 24-25)





### **Duties:**

- Respect of the job contract
- Regular progress reports
- Follow-up and validation of training courses (90h min), including:
  - Ethic and Integrity: Mandatory!!
  - ➤ Electronic manuscript deposition (Mist 29/30): Mandatory!!
- Meet minimal criteria for PhD defence:
  - Proposition by the thesis director(s): MANDATORY
  - 1 first author submitted/published paper
  - Positive appreciation of thesis manuscript by two independent referees:
    - not belonging to UCA
    - No common publication, neither with the PhD student, nor with thesis director(s) in the 4 past years.

#### DOCTORAL CHARTER

#### Preamble

The terms doctoral student, thesis supervisor, research unit director and doctoral school director used here are generic and refer, respectively, to the doctoral student, the person(s) appointed supervisor or cosupervisor of the doctoral student, the person(s) appointed research unit director and the person(s) appointed doctoral school director.





#### What is needed to defend:



- High quality research results
- Participation to JEDN meetings
- Research training courses and scientific exchanges: >30h / 4j
- Professional training courses approved by UCA: >30h
   (not for MDs, dentists, Cifre, clinicians, ...)
- At least one first author original article (not a review)





# Before thesis defence, please remember:

- The procedures must be initiated at least 10 weeks before the defence and will be carried out exclusively via the ADUM platform;
- Trainings: « Deposit of the Thesis » and ethic trainings are mandatory to obtain the authorization to defend the thesis.
- Deposit of the manuscript on ADUM: at least 8 weeks before the defence.





You may need more time...

Year 1 Year 2 Year 3 Year 4

- Ask for a derogation of thesis duration, with justification
- Agreement of PhD supervisor and IFC positive advice
- Get financial support for the extra-duration
- Registration mandatory (no diploma deliverance w/o)





### What is needed to defend:

### Remember:

A PhD is a demanding qualification. Enrolment in a doctoral program at the ED does not automatically guarantee authorization to defend and obtain the diploma.







### Whatever the funding:


- The candidate must be evaluated by the ED Council:
  - Application form completed with grades and ranks
  - Motivation letter
  - Agreement letter of potential PhD supervisor
  - Submitted on the ED website
- The project must be evaluated by the ED Council:
  - The project belongs to the school's scientific perimeter
  - It respects ethical rules
  - Previous PhD supervised by the thesis director have published as 1st authors





# Individual Follow-up Committee: IFC Comité de Suivi Individuel: CSI

- To be constituted during 1<sup>st</sup> year
- Yearly report for registration before Sept. 1<sup>st</sup>
- Mandatory for re-inscription in ADUM
- Positive opinion of the committee required for a 4<sup>th</sup> year derogation

#### Goals:

- ➤ Assistance in the development of the thesis
- Detect problems, bring solutions (not only scientific questions!)
- Reflecting on the after thesis
- ...Not a "mini defence"







# Individual **follow-up** committee: IFC Comité de Suivi Individuel: CSI

### **IFC Minimal Composition**

- PhD student
- Research supervisor (and co-supervisor)
- 1 scientist from UniCA (not in your lab)
- 1 scientist out of UCA

#### IFC members and PhD defence

- cannot be referees for the thesis
- can participate to the jury as examinators or invited members
- Select carrefully your IFC committee
- Not necessarly « specialists» of your thesis subject
- You can propose lecturers from your LMD.
- Avoid thesis Director friends (conflict of interest)
- See the Thesis Chart, and the guide for CSI (soon available on the ED website)

### New in the August 26th PhD text: <u>Discrimination, sexual, moral harassment</u>

"During the interview with the doctoral student, the committee assesses the conditions of his/her training and the progress of his/her research. During this same interview, it is particularly vigilant in identifying any form of conflict, discrimination, moral or sexual harassment or sexist behaviour. It makes recommendations and sends a report of the interview to the director of the doctoral school, the doctoral student and the thesis director. "In the event of difficulties, the doctoral student's individual monitoring committee alerts the doctoral school, which takes any necessary measures relating to the doctoral student's situation and the progress of the doctorate.

"As soon as the doctoral school becomes aware of acts of violence, discrimination, moral or sexual harassment or sexist behaviour, it reports them to the institution's anti-discrimination and anti-sexist violence unit.
